## DO AS DIRECTED

“Do as directed” - is a Grammatical Instruction that has been set as questions in different classes' English Exam Paper. “Do as directed” is not Grammar itself. Different types of Grammatical Topics have been given together as questions under “Do as directed” section.

### Grammatical Topics under Do as directed:

The Grammatical Topics that have been given under do as directed section add questions are –

- (1) Affirmative sentence to Negative sentence & vice versa.
- (2) Interrogative Sentence to Assertive Sentence & vice versa.
- (3) Exclamatory Sentence to Assertive Sentence & vice versa.
- (4) Interchange of Degree of Comparison.
- (5) Interchange of parts of speech.
- (6) Voice Change
- (7) Narration Change
- (8) Joining
